Now there was a woman who had been suffering from haemorrhages for twelve years. She had endured much under many physicians, and had spent all that she had; and she was no better, but rather grew worse. She had heard about Jesus, and came up behind him in the crowd and touched his cloak, for she said, "If I but touch his clothes, I will be made well." Immediately her haemorrhage stopped; and she felt in her body that she was healed of her disease. Immediately aware that power had gone forth from him, Jesus turned about in the crowd and said, "Who touched my clothes?" And his disciples said to him, "You see the crowd pressing in on you; how can you say, 'Who touched me?'" He looked all around to see who had done it. But the woman, knowing what had happened to her, came in fear and trembling, fell down before him, and told him the whole truth. He said to

her, "Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace, and be healed of your disease."

While he was still speaking, some people came from the leader's house to say, "Your daughter is dead. Why trouble the teacher any further?" But overhearing what they said, Jesus said to the leader of the synagogue, "Do not fear, only believe."

# MEDICAL MISSIONARY AND MEMBER OF ST. GILES







Pauline Brown spent her 55 years in India working under the Church of North India in various capacities, but always with a focus on health care and education. Travelling around the rolling hills of the Bhil field with her mobile clinic, heading up community health programs that train locals in hygiene, first aid, nutrition and midwifery, teaching at schools of nursing, participating in the women's group at her church in Jobat, or simply welcoming people in her home, she strove to make life better for others.

She received the Order of Canada in 2001.

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
