# Scripture

First Reading: Exodus 16:1–15

The whole congregation of the Israelites set out from Elim and came to the wilderness of Sin, which is between Elim and Sinai, on the fifteenth day of the second month after they had departed from the land of Egypt. The whole congregation of the Israelites complained against Moses and Aaron in the wilderness. The Israelites said to them, "If only we had died by the hand of the Lord in the land of Egypt, when we sat by the pots of meat and ate our fill of bread, for you have brought us out into this wilderness to kill this whole assembly with hunger."

Then the Lord said to Moses, "I am going to rain bread from heaven for you, and each day the people shall go out and gather enough for that day. In that way I will test them, whether they will follow my instruction or not. On the sixth day, when they prepare what they bring in, it will be twice as much as they gather on other days." So Moses and Aaron said

to all the Israelites, "In the evening you shall know that it was the Lord who brought you out of the land of Egypt, and in the morning you shall see the glory of the Lord, because he has heard your complaining against the Lord. For what are we, that you complain against us?" And Moses said, "When the Lord gives you meat to eat in the evening and your fill of bread in the morning, because the Lord has heard the complaining that you utter against him—what are we? Your complaining is not against us but against the Lord."

Then Moses said to Aaron, "Say to the whole congregation of the Israelites: 'Draw near to the Lord, for he has heard your complaining.' " And as Aaron spoke to the whole congregation of the Israelites, they looked toward the wilderness, and the glory of the Lord appeared in the cloud. The Lord spoke to Moses, "I have heard the complaining of the Israelites; say to them, 'At twilight you shall eat meat, and in the morning you shall have your fill of bread; then you shall know that I am the Lord your God.' "

In the evening quails came up and covered the camp, and in the morning there was a layer of dew around the camp. When the layer of dew lifted, there on the surface of the wilderness was a fine flaky substance, as fine as frost on the ground. When the Israelites saw it, they said to one another, "What is it?" For they

did not know what it was. Moses said to them, "It is the bread that the Lord has given you to eat.

Psalm 105: 1–6, 37–45 (with refrain 1)

O give thanks to the Lord; call on God's name; make known God's deeds among the peoples.

Sing to the Lord, sing praises;

tell of all God's wonderful works.

Glory in God's holy name;

let the hearts of those who seek the Lord rejoice.

Seek the strength of the Lord; seek the Lord's presence continually.

Remember the wonderful works God has done, the miracles, the judgments God has uttered, O offspring of Abraham, God's servant, children of Jacob, God's chosen ones.

Then the Lord brought Israel out with silver and gold, and there was no one among their tribes who stumbled.

Egypt was glad when they departed, for dread of them had fallen upon it.

The Lord spread a cloud for a covering and fire to give light by night.

They asked, and the Lord brought quails and gave them food from heaven in abundance.

The Lord opened the rock, and water gushed out; it flowed through the desert like a river.

The Lord remembered the holy promise

#### made to Abraham, God's servant.

So the Lord brought the people out with joy, the chosen ones with singing.

The Lord gave them the lands of the nations, and they took possession of the wealth of the peoples,

that they might keep God's statutes and observe God's laws.

All: Praise the Lord!
