Scripture

First Reading: Deuteronomy 6:1–9

"Now this is the commandment—the statutes and the ordinances—that the Lord your God charged me to teach you to observe in the land that you are about to cross into and occupy, so that you and your children and your children's children may fear the Lord your God all the days of your life and keep all his decrees and his commandments that I am commanding you, so that your days maybe long. Hear therefore, O Israel, and observe them diligently, so that it may go well with you and so that you may multiply greatly in a land flowing with milk and honey, as the Lord, the God of your ancestors, has promised you.

"Hear, O Israel: The Lord is our God, the Lord alone. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might. Keep these words that I am commanding you today in your heart. Recite them to your children and talk about them when you are at home and when you are away, when you lie down and when you rise. Second Reading: Mark 12:28-34

Jesus answered, "The first is, 'Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God, the Lord is one; you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' The second is this, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these." Then the scribe said to him, "You are right, Teacher; you have truly said that 'he is one, and besides him there is no other'; and 'to love him with all the heart and with all the understanding and with all the strength' and 'to love one's neighbor as oneself'—this is much more important than all whole burnt offerings and sacrifices." When Jesus saw that he answered wisely, he said to him, "You are not far from the kingdom of God." After that no one dared to ask him any question.

News from Session



Petition: Let Ottawa taxpayers decide on \$493 million for Lansdowne

The Glebe Community Association has endorsed the Better Ottawa Lansdowne Petition, which calls for the City of Ottawa to hold a binding referendum before approving the demolition and rebuilding of the stadium at Lansdowne. The cost of this reconstruction will be an estimated \$493 million a staggering amount given that Mayor Sutcliffe has declared the city to be in a financial crisis. City Council will make a final decision on the stadium in late 2025 so there is still time to have a say in how our tax dollars are being spent. In the interests of greater financial transparency and public consultation, the GCA encourages you to read the petition and support this initiative.
