

Mission Moment

In Nepal, 60-year old Sakkal Bahadur Shahi lacked the means to transform his farm into a sustainable, incomegenerating operation. Sakkal's situation improved when he joined a PWS&D-supported project – a self-help group working to improve the living standards of poor members in their community. With training, Sakkal was able to transform his farm into a model farm, adopting climate-resilient farming practices to grow various vegetables. He is now better able to support his family through his farm.
