<u>Chancel (Cameron) Window</u>: Erected by the congregation in grateful memory of the first Minister of St. Giles 1926-30, the Rev. Archibald G. Cameron B.A., D.D. It was unveiled by his son Col. Hugh Cameron, M.D. elder of Kirk session at his father's church.

<u>The Cairns Window</u>: Installed in memory of Doctor Robert M. Cairns, member of the Board of Managers and Medical Examiner, Department of Veterans Affairs. The window was designed and completed by Pikes of Ottawa and given by Mrs. R.M. Cairns and son Robert.

<u>The Spratt and Young Window</u>: The central panel is a copy of Hunt's painting "Jesus the Light of the World". Donated by members of both families in memory of Richard and Charlotte Spratt and Robert and Christina Young.

<u>The Millar Window</u>: We see the text "Blessed are the pure in heart for they shall see God". It is in loving memory of James A. Millar, a founding member of St. Giles, trustee, Church School teacher and Roll Clerk for many years. Given by his wife.

<u>The Adamson Window: In memory of Warrant Officer first Class J. Douglas Adamson, elder and Church School teacher.</u> The scriptural passage is "Be of good cheer, be not afraid". The figure on the left side is that of St. Andrew. On the right, St. Michael. Donated by his wife.

<u>The Reid Window</u>: A very fine four panel window at the narthex. The biblical references, "Suffer the little children to come unto me and forbid them not", "And He took them up in His arms, put his hands upon them and blessed them", are featured. Given in loving memory of John Reid by his daughter Mary.

<u>The MacTavish Window</u>: It depicts Sir Galahad in three panels. In memory of Alistair Stuart MacTavish by members of his family.

<u>The Wayne Sparks Window</u>: The scene in the garden of Gethsemane. The words of Jesus depict a calm resignation to do the will of God. "Nevertheless, not my will but thine be done". Inscription: in loving memory of a dear son and brother, G. Wayne Sparks. Given by members of the family.

<u>The Alexander Vessie Window</u>: This window develops the theme of praise, vocal and instrumental. The middle light shows King David, playing the harp. The left and right figures also symbolize music. Given by his wife and son lan.

<u>The Lewis Window</u>: Depicting the Resurrection, with the inscription: in loving memory of J. Ezra Lewis and his wife Ena. Donated by their daughter Wanda.

The McIntosh-Gliddon Window: In memory of Mrs. McIntosh-Gliddon. Donated by the family in 1997.

<u>The Cunningham Window</u>: Dedicated to Robert and Jesse Cunningham by their daughters Eva, Helen and Jean.

<u>The Dale Window</u>: Illustrating a passage from Mark, Matthew and John. In memory of Margaret and William Dale, given by their family.

<u>The Urquhart Window</u>: Features the biblical passage "Then He rose and rebuked the winds and the sea". In memory of Gordon and Mary Urquhart given by John, Jane and family.

<u>The Logan-Vencta Window</u>: In the balcony facing west towards Bank St. featuring an inscription from the 23rd Psalm "The Lord is my shepherd I shall not want". Dedicated to the memory of Col. Rev. Dr. Logan-Vencta OBE Principal chaplain of the CCS in 1945 and 1946, Minister of St. Giles 1931-1969. The window was completed and installed in 1979.
