

First Reading: Jeremiah 4:11-12, 22-28

At that time it will be said to this people and to Jerusalem: A hot wind comes from me out of the bare heights in the desert toward the daughter of my people, not to winnow or cleanse, a wind too strong for that. Now it is I who speak in judgment against them.

"For my people are foolish; they do not know me; they are stupid children; they have no understanding.

They are skilled in doing evil but do not know how to do good."

I looked on the earth, and it was complete chaos, and to the heavens, and they had no light.

I am grateful to Christ Jesus our Lord, who has strengthened me, because he considered me faithful and appointed me to his service, even though I was formerly a blasphemer, a persecutor, and a man of violence. But I received mercy because I had acted ignorantly in unbelief, and the grace of our Lord overflowed for me with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. The saying is sure and worthy of full acceptance: that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners—of whom I am the foremost. But for that very reason I received mercy, so that in me, as the foremost, Jesus Christ might display the utmost patience as an example to those who would come to believe in him for eternal life. The Presbyteries of Ottawa and Seaway-Glengarry are delighted to share the return of the Fall Youth Retreat, taking place **Friday October 3-Sunday, October 5 at Gracefield Christian Camp and Retreat Centre.** This event is for youth aged 11-17. This year's theme is Grounded: how do we stay grounded in Jesus as the core of our faith in the midst of everything else life throws our way?
